

New Zealand School System

In New Zealand students begin formal education at the age of 5 when they enter Primary School.

Primary School may include the levels Year 1 — Year 8. If you are enrolling at an Intermediate School then you would enter at Year 7 for 2 years, encompassing Years 7 and 8 (approximate student ages are 11–13 years old).

After Intermediate School students progress to High School (also known as College). High School begins at Year 9 and goes through to Year 13 (approx. student ages 13–18).

Primary/Intermediate schools build a strong foundation in literacy and numeracy and introduce a broad and balanced curriculum. The Technology/Science Curriculums are developed further at Northcross Intermediate School.

Secondary schools focus on subject learning, with growing opportunities to specialise as students progress in their learning. Child-focused learning and independent thinking are encouraged at all levels of learning. Formal qualifications begin in Year 11.

School Calendar

The New Zealand school year is divided into 4 school terms (approximately 10 weeks per term) with a two week holiday break in between each term.

Term 1: usually begins late January early February through to Mid April

Term 2: Late April — early July

Term 3: Late July-late September

Term 4: Mid October-Mid December
